



Audio Panel Basic Setting Procedures Cessna N5727E



1. Yes, a lot of buttons but most are not needed for primary flight training. We'll keep it simple.
2. When the "Starting Engine" checklist directs you to Check/Set Audio, the above picture shows you what to look for and the switch settings to check for basic Radio #1 Transmit and Receive capabilities. Radio #1 is set on 122.7 CTAF at Jack Edwards Airport.
3. The RED BOX area is the only portion of the Audio Panel that you need to become familiar with for your private pilot training. The picture shows the correct AUDIO panel setting to transmit and receive on 122.7. The MIC switch (far right) is set on com 1 and the bottom AUTO button (phones) is depressed which means it is active.
4. When you are ready to listen to the AWOS at KJKA press the ↔ button on Radio #1 to move 134.525 over to the "use" position and leave the audio panel set as is.
5. After receiving the AWOS information return your Radio #1 to 122.7 CTAF by pressing the ↔ button.

Later in your training you will be instructed on the use of Radio #2 and the AUDIO panel settings for "Dual Com" operations.
